On 07/30/13 at approximately 2218 hrs, Ptlm. Aylward and I were dispatched initially to the area of 24 Bullock Ave. for a reported loud party. Upon arrival on Bullock Ave., I was flagged down by the calling party, whom identified himself as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said that he can hear loud music in [REDACTED] that faces the water, he described to me which house the loud music was coming from, he said third driveway on the left [REDACTED], a long driveway that goes all the way back. The driveway he described actually belonged to 26 Bullock Ave. not 24 Bullock Ave. as initially reported.

As I approached the driveway, I observed numerous cars parked on the street. From the street the music was clearly audible. As I pulled down the driveway at 26 Bullock Ave I observed more vehicle parked on the grass on either side of the driveway. I then saw three young male subjects coming up the driveway in my direction, two out of the three were carrying silver, blue, and white cans in each hand, later identified as 12 oz. cans of Natural Light beer that were unopened and cold to the touch. I exited my patrol car and told them to come and talk to me. All three subjects changed direction, and began to head back down the north side of the house towards the backyard and dropped the cans on the ground as they jogged towards the back yard.

I followed the individuals in the direction of the back yard, approaching the northern side of the house. I reached the end of the driveway, and I was able to see an adult male subject, known to me through prior police contacts as Bruce Becker, the homeowner at 26 Bullock Ave. I called to him "Mr. Becker." He looked at me turned and began to run into the back yard, as he did this I heard him say "Oh god the police are here, everyone run!" Becker tripped slightly as he ran. Becker had on gray cargo shorts, and a white tank top. I went into the back yard and as I turned the corner I observed approximately 30 individuals begin to flee around the south side of the residence. I advised them to stop, but they continued to flee. I radioed for additional units and advised them of the mass exodus, but my radio was unreadable to dispatch.

I stopped for a moment to look around the back yard. I observed a table with numerous red solo cups on top, arranged in a pattern on either side. I recognized this through training and experience to be evidence "beirut" a.k.a. "beer pong" a common drinking game. There was dj audio equipment on the back deck. There were numerous full and empty beer cans throughout the yard, there were bottles of liquor out in plainview near a rear entrance at the residence along with an open 30 pack of Natural Light that was also cold to the touch and wet with condensation.

I made my way towards the front of the residence in hopes of preventing some of the partygoers from leaving, and to make contact with Becker. As I approached the front door to the residence that was wide open, there were some individuals attempting to leave, I advised them to go back inside, and I followed them inside the residence. I asked them where the homeowner was but the small group did not know. I was in the front foyer area, when I made contact with Becker. Becker came down a staircase from the second floor, and now had a blue/gray button down shirt on. I asked what was going on here? Becker said that he was having a party for his son. I asked him about the alcohol in the back yard, and why he ran and told everyone to leave when he saw me approach? Becker said he did not know there was any alcohol at the party, and that he purchased soda for the kids. I collected his driver's license and directed him to the rear deck. Outside, part of the original group that fled, made their way into the back yard, but when they saw me they ran a second time towards the road. I was able to stop one individual, identified as [REDACTED]. I collected his identification and had him take a seat on the back deck. I then stopped a group of four male subjects, later identified as [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED]. All parties gave their information and ID's to me and waited on the back deck. Becker was

outside with the youths, and I asked him again why he ran and told everyone to leave when he saw me. He said that he did see the police approach, and he did go in the back yard, but denied any knowledge of alcohol. I told him that it was impossible due to the fact there were multiple containers scattered throughout the yard. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] also denied consuming any alcohol, and also told me that Bruce Becker had no knowledge of what was going on in the back yard.

At this time, Ptlm. Aylward, Sgt. Igoe, and Ptlm. Pimentel arrived on scene. Ptlm. Pimentel waited with the subjects on the back deck, while I briefed Sgt. Igoe and went to my patrol car to provide their information to dispatch. When I returned to my patrol car, Ptlm. Aylward had [REDACTED] in custody for possession of a bottle of UV whipped cream vodka. Sgt. Igoe remained in the back yard and took photographs of the scene. After providing dispatch with the various information, I observed two individuals emerge from the front yard. One I immediately recognized as [REDACTED] from prior police contacts, and the other was a female, identified as [REDACTED]. I took their information and brought them into the back yard to wait with the rest of the group, and to make arrangements for a ride home since they are both juveniles. I asked [REDACTED] how long he had been at the party and he told me for about an hour. I asked him how much he had to drink? [REDACTED] said he had a couple beers. [REDACTED] denied consuming any alcoholic beverage.

I went to the back yard with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and they joined the rest of the group in the kitchen, where they were waiting with Ptlm. Pimentel. One additional male subject was now present, identified as [REDACTED]. The adult male subjects: [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] were given an opportunity to take a PBT before they left, but all refused. It should be noted that Becker was in the background telling all of them not to take the PBT. They were released from the scene. [REDACTED] was picked up by his mother [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] was given parental permission to stay at 26 Bullock Ave. for the night.

I then advised Becker to turn around and place his hands behind his back, and he was placed into handrestraints without incident. The cuffs were double locked and checked for tightness prior to transport. Becker was brought back to police headquarters where he was processed. Becker was advised of his constitutional rights and refused to make a formal statement. Becker was charged under social host law, and was arraigned by JP Montecalvo and released on PR.

The alcohol and empty containers that were seized were labeled appropriately placed in bags, and secured in the rear evidence compound.
